Therefore, before God, I seek the enlargement of my heart at this moment,

that there may be room enough for Peace."

# GIVE THANKS IN ALL CIRCUMSTANCES

We are thankful in all circumstances because no matter what we are facing in life ... God is still in control and God's presence is still with you. This means that His love, His mercy, His compassion, and all the other wonderful things God is and does are still with you. They are with you because you are His dearly loved child. And to prove that, God sent Jesus, His only Son, so that anyone who believes in Him may have eternal life.

So, in this month of reflection on what it is we are thankful for and especially this coming week of Thanksgiving holidays... the thing I'm most thankful for is this ... the love, mercy, and grace of God given to us in Jesus Christ. ### **EVERYDAY ELECTION DAY!**

I write this on November 5, Election Day for the US government. Our new President will either be the first woman to become President, or the only to second man to win, lose, then win again our nation's highest office. But spiritually speaking, *every* day is "election day."

But first, some trivia. George Washington was unanimously elected as our first President in 1789, but our system of self-governance goes back much further. The colony of Jamestown elected "Burgesses" (citizens who represented a "borough" or neighborhood) in 1619. They first convened *in their church's choir loft*! I love that!

Long before that, as the temple in Jerusalem was being dedicated, God gave King Solomon, the Children of Israel, and us today an important If/Then promise. *IF* we humble ourselves, pray, seek His face, and turn from our wicked ways, *THEN* He promises to hear, to forgive, and to restore. (2 Chronicles 7:14) We truly need that today, so it's a popular, often quoted verse.



As we do that, God's If/Then promises in 2 Chronicles are transformed from something of an ominous threat to a reassuring comfort. As we keep our part of the promise, His becomes our source of hope, joy, strength, and peace regardless of how American politics go.

We Christians are called by His name. *Every* day, may we elect to live like it. (And a good place to start anew is in the choir loft!)
