The new semester for our music ministry kicked off Wednesday, as our Choir got together again after a well deserved summer break. They got a first peak at the music for Christmas on the Avenue, 2024, which is scheduled for December 8 in the Great Room of First Methodist Church.

"The Ballad of Bethlehem, A Timeless Story of God's Love" is a brand new Christmas musical by Pepper Choplin, a fellow Baptist composer, conductor, and humorist. Pepper is one of the most creative writers in church music today. He's written 24 church cantatas, over 330 anthems for church and school, 4 books of piano arrangements, and more than 150 commissioned works. One of his hymns, "Come to the Water," is in our Celebrating Grace hymnal, #448.

It's not too late to join us for this only-in-Eatonton project that brings our community together in amazing ways. Nor is it too late to join our Choir or JuBELLation handbell choir. Just let me or the church office know of your interest, and we'll make it happen.

Sunday morning, August 25, our worship will be led by pianist extraordinaire, Jeff Cleghorn. His music degrees from Mercer and Luther Rice Universities are only a small part of the ways he has honed his God given gifts. Jeff says, "God has put a song in my heart. Whenever I sit down at the piano keyboard, my desire is that the listener hears God sing that song through my hands. He alone is worthy of all praise and glory." The music that Jeff provides will be uplifting and encouraging to the people that hear. He is committed to providing music that is, above all, honoring to the Lord. That primary commitment to exalt the Savior will be evident as Jeff plays the piano or leads your people in worship. We will receive a Love Offering at the door following his concert.

JuBELLation, our handbell choir, kicks off their new semester on Sunday, September 15, at 1:30. We have a couple of positions available. No experience is necessary, though some understanding of musical rhythm is helpful.

Our Choir will be singing a fantastic new anthem this fall, written by Terry York and David Schwoebel, "The Same Christ Calls." It reminds us that the same God we see in the Old and New Testaments remains with us today, as much of a reliable foundation for our lives as He was back then.






