

## FROM THE PASTOR

Joyce Rupp has been a recent re-connect of mine. I've been reading her as a part of my devotional readings. Her entry is *The Face Reveals the Soul*. She recalls Irish author John O'Donohue who relished the beauty in others:

"In the human face, the anonymity of the universe becomes intimate ... The face is the mirror of the mind ... Each face is a particular intensity of human presence. When you love someone and are separated from them for a long time, it is lovely to receive a letter or a phone call or even, in the silence of your own spirit, to sense their presence. Yet there is such deeper excitement when you return again and see the face you love; at this moment you enjoy a feast of seeing. In that face, you see the intensity and depth of loving presence looking towards you and meeting you ... The human face is the subtle yet visual autobiography of each person. ... The face always reveals the soul; it is where the divinity of the inner life finds an echo and image. When you behold someone's face, you are gazing deeply into his or her life."

Rupp reminds us of the blessing from the Old Testament book of Numbers. The blessing asks, "the Lord make his face to shine upon you" or as another translation says, "the Lord turn his face toward you."

Rupp challenges us, to turn our faces toward others. Look at the variety of faces among which you live. "Open your mind and heart to their invisible stories and the journey of their souls. Find joy and solace in the recognition that a spirit drenched in divine goodness rests at the core of each person whose face you observe ... And then, rejoice that God's face is shining upon you."

Also, as teachers and students prepare to return to the classroom, lift them up in your prayers. Send the students and teachers you know a short text or card, encouraging them in their vital tasks as they resume the school rhythm. Send a card to one of the local schools to post on their office bulletin board that offers blessing and love for the task ahead of everyone in the school. Through the missions committee our church sends each school a monetary gift to be used as needed for students who show up inadequately prepared for class.

May students, teachers and staff be blessed with the hopes of another beginning.

May patience abound, for themselves and others.

May joy be ignited as they work together.

May the faces, and the souls behind them be nurtured.

## A GREAT WAY TO END THE DAY

#### Evening Prayer . . . A Great Way to End the Day!

Last month, I mentioned how praying Luther's Morning Prayer is a great way to start the day. A sweet friend here at FBCE after reading my June article, asked me if there was also an evening prayer, and if so, could I share it with them? Well, Luther did in fact also write an Evening Prayer that could be a great way to end the day! If you are unfamiliar with Luther's Evening prayer, it reads as follows:

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have graciously kept me this day; and I pray that You would forgive me all my sins where I have done wrong, and graciously keep me this night. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

As Christians, we never know what a day is going to have in store for us when we wake up. However, when we are going to bed at night, we can think back on the day and know exactly how that day went. It could have been a good day, or the opposite could have been true. We sinned against God, we commit errors against each other, even our health may have taken an unexpected turn. We could have had a very bad day!

So, there we are going to bed at night with a bad day in our rear view mirror. What do we do with that? Are we lying in bed stewing over what we did, and what we didn't do? Are we laying there staring at the ceiling with regret thinking, "If only I had said that just a little bit differently." As we are unable to sleep, are we thinking about what tomorrow is going to bring, afraid it might be worse than today?

What I love most about Luther's Evening Prayer is not only do we ask God to forgive us of any sins we committed that day, but even more so, we pray this, "For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things." As we are preparing to close our eyes and rest for the night, we are resting not just into a bed, but even more so, we are resting in the loving embrace of our Savior Jesus Christ who will always be with us and who always offers to us His peace. In this prayer, we are literally saying to Jesus, "Forgive me of my sins, turn the troubles of this life from troubles into blessings, and allow me to receive a rest that you and you alone can give."

There is truly no greater way to rest at night, than to do so knowing we are always resting in the arms of our loving Savior, Jesus Christ.
