I have been serving for almost 12 years on staff at different churches, and I still need to be reminded why student ministry is important. I need to be reminded because the truth is that student ministry can be difficult. Many times, it's just easier to let children and teens do what they want and think they don't desire or need adults in their lives. It may be easy to ignore them, but the truth is that they are desperate for adults to actually show up and invest in their life on a consistent basis. Consistency is big because so much of life today is inconsistent. The typical American dream is fading. Family life is always changing. Teens are being forced to make choices about their future (college and career) at a time when they are just figuring out who they are. Teens need consistency and they need it from the church more than ever.

I really believe that in a culture that is continually changing, Jesus is the one thing that will always be unchanging Jesus is relevant today and forever. Student ministries all across the country have the chance to partner with the church and with families to lead teens to Jesus. That's why what we do in youth ministry is important.

3 THINGS YOU CAN DO FOR OUR STUDENT MINISTRY AT FBCE:

- 1) **PRAY.** Pray for our students, our staff and volunteers. That through the help of the Holy Spirit we might connect with students and help them to know or grow in Christ.

- 3) **SHOW UP.** The hardest part of Student Ministry is feeling like we are fighting against everything else students and families are doing. There are 168 hours in a week. We meet for just 1.5 hours each week.

A week ago, both I and my ambulance crew thought I was having a heart attack. They rushed me to the ER, where everyone there initially thought the same thing. Thankfully, that wasn't the case, though I await further testing to find out what caused this little adventure.

Before I go any further, I want to sincerely thank those who prayed for me, my wife, and my medical team. I love and appreciate you!

An experience like that has a way of turning your thoughts to when your time here on earth is ended, and you graduate from this life to the next. By God's grace I'm ready when that time comes, but until then I have work to do. "Work? I thought you were retired," you wonder. You're right to an extent. I no longer am on the job 60+ hours a week, though I do enjoy continuing to serve our Lord and His people part time.

But that's not the kind of work I'm talking about. My real work is the same as every Christian:

- * loving the Lord my God with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength, and my neighbor as myself;
- * being an ongoing student of God's Word, and a witness to what I've seen Him do in my life and in others;
- * praying for others, especially Prodigal sons and daughters like me.

We who are parents and grandparents often pray for our sons, daughters, and grandchildren. That's the prayer of Jean Valjeans in Act 2 of *Les Miserables*. Now an old man who has fought many battles, he knows that everyone there at the barricade that night at the beginning of the French Revolution is likely to die before morning.

He is willing for himself, but his heart breaks for young Marius, the fiancé of his beloved daughter. As he stands guard over the sleeping, doomed young man, he sings a heart wrenching prayer, "Bring Him Home."

As I play this song Sunday on my EWI (electronic wind instrument), I invite you to join me in asking our Heavenly Father to bring safely home, to Himself and to us, all the prodigals in our own lives, perhaps even ourselves. Singing and praising, serving and praying – this is our job for as long as we have our being!


